






Rare Aladin Luxe white ceramic motorcar lamp, 1920s


A huge Imperial Russian 'Trompe l'oeil' silver cigar box by Ivan Evstigneev of St. Petersburg, circa 1885
























Art Deco cigar box by Cartier New York, with 14ct gold detailing, set gemstones and bracket feet. American, circa 1930



A breathtaking 18ct gold table lighter in the form of a lighthouse by Alfred Dunhill, the lighthouse set on a solid section of AAA-grade amethyst geode and featuring hand-cut beveled amethyst windows and lantern, all illuminating from within. The lantern hinges open to reveal a removable 18ct gold butane lighter. This unique table lighter featured in Dunhill's Christmas collection catalogue over 40 years ago and was also listed in the Guinness Book of Records in 1987, as the most expensive table lighter ever to be recorded.
